



what does it mean to believe in Jesus?

Believing in Jesus means trusting in the person and accomplishment of Jesus.

We believe in the person of Jesus by trusting that Jesus is God's only Son and by choosing to trust Him to forgive our sins and lead us.

We believe in the accomplishment of Jesus by acknowledging that we are separated from God because of our sin and by trusting that, through Jesus' death and resurrection, He has provided the only way for us to be reunited with God.

This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus to all who believe. There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Jesus.

He canceled the record of the charges against us and took it away by nailing it to the cross. In this way, he disarmed the spiritual rulers and authorities. He shamed them publicly by his victory over them on the cross.

what is sin?



Sin is more than just breaking the Ten Commandments; we sin when we choose our way over God's way.

When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

what is the answer to sin?

God sent Jesus to take upon Himself all the sins of mankind, on the cross, thereby allowing those who believe to receive forgiveness for all sins. God offers new life to all who believe in the person and accomplishment of Jesus and make Him their Lord.

I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.



how do I know if I believe?

1 PETER 1|8-9


your immediate response to that belief is baptism

03 what is baptism?

an expression of faith

Baptism does not make you a follower of Christ. Every example we see in the Bible demonstrates that first a person is to believe in Jesus and then baptism is an expression of that belief.

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast.

EPHESIANS 2|8-9

an identification

Baptism is the means by which followers of Jesus are identified. In Matthew 28|19, Jesus commands His followers:

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...

an illustration of Jesus' death and resurrection


In Romans 6|1–11, the apostle Paul explains how baptism by immersion identifies the believer with the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. Going underwater signifies Jesus' death and coming up out of the water illustrates His resurrection. Baptism symbolizes your commitment to enthrone Jesus as the Lord of your life and live like Him.

following Jesus' example

At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan River.

MARK 1|9

following Jesus' command

Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you.

demonstrating your faith

...many of the Corinthians who heard him believed and were baptized.

ACTS 18|8

How are we to be baptized?

Jesus was baptized by being immersed in water.

As soon as Jesus was baptized, He went up out of the water.

MATTHEW 3|16A

Every baptism in the Bible was by immersion.

Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water...

ACTS 8|38-39

The word "baptized" literally means to dip or immerse under water. Baptism by immersion is the best way to illustrate a burial and resurrection.

Who should be baptized?

Those who accepted (believed) his message were baptized...

ACTS 2|41

Every person mature enough to make a personal decision to submit their life to Jesus, to follow Him and His teachings, should be baptized.

When should I be baptized?

As soon as you have decided to fully follow the way of Jesus, you should be baptized.

Then Philip began with that very passage of scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. As they traveled along the road they came to some water and the eunuch said 'Look, here is water. Why shouldn't I be baptized?' And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him.'

ACTS 8|35-38

Can my family be baptized together?

Yes, provided each family member understands the meaning of baptism and has placed his or her faith in Jesus. Children under twelve years old are asked to attend our Baptism Class for kids before proceeding with baptism. For infants we offer child dedication twice a year.

When do baptisms take place?

Baptisms take place after all our services and at other pre-arranged times.

What should I wear for my baptism?

We provide you with a shirt and knee-length swim shorts. We will provide a place to change out of your wet clothes. We have towels and plastic bags to hold your wet clothing after you change.

Where do I go on the day of my baptism?

Just come forward to the stage after a service or speak with one of our prayer volunteers.


when writing your story, please focus on these points:
